Why do Christians worship?

In response to God's redemptive love, we want to offer worship which:

- \circ $\;$ Glorifies and is edifying to God.
- Feeds and nourishes us deeply, enabling us to encounter and be transformed by God.
- Enables people of all ages, with or without a church background to find an authentic welcome and connect with God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit through worship which is accessible (physically) and appropriate in its language and teaching. Nobody should feel there are barriers to worship.
- Is missional (reflecting all five marks of mission -<u>https://www.churchofengland.org/sites/default/files/2017-</u> <u>11/mtag-the-5-marks-of-mission.pdf</u>)

How do we worship?

- Acknowledging that people connect with God in diverse ways, all of which delight God, worship is offered through a balance of service styles from worship which is traditional in its language, liturgy or music, through to worship which is informal or contemporary in its language, style or music.
- To offer every style / language in each church, would need about fifteen services each Sunday, which is impractical and lacking in a sense of communal worship. With the exception of the Team Service on the first Sunday of the month, we aim to offer both formal and less formal services in each half of the parish (i.e. north / south) each Sunday. There will also be at least one family-friendly service in each half of the parish each Sunday.
- We want children and young families to feel at home within the physical and worshipping landscape of each church, and to discover the joy of knowing and worshipping God. Some of our services are particularly offered with children in mind (in **blue** on the service schedule). We also aim to have Bible-based activity sheets available for children for the moments in worship which are more adult-focused.

A brief description of each style of worship

- 8.00am Holy Communion from the Book of Common Prayer
 - A 30-40 minute Communion service in traditional language with a short homily, without hymns.
- 11.00am Holy Communion at Chilton Foliat
 - This follows Common Worship Order One Communion but in traditional language. Hymns are sung. A sermon is preached.
- Other Holy Communion services
 - Common Worship Order One Communion (modern language) with a sermon and hymns.
- Café Church
 - Informal, interactive, sitting at tables and chairs, with refreshments. Hymns and worship songs may be led by a range of instruments.
- Informal Worship
 - Relaxed, with a simple liturgical shape, accessible to all ages.
 Teaching may be accompanied by drama or other illustrations. A blend of traditional hymns and modern worship songs.
- Contemporary Worship
 - Contemporary worship songs, a relaxed style of worship, gently open to the prompting of the Holy Spirit. Includes a testimony, a reflection and an opportunity for the Holy Spirit to minister to us.
- Families@4
 - A new opportunity for families to gather for appropriate worship and fellowship in Aldbourne.
- Matins
 - A service of Morning Prayer in traditional language from the Book of Common Prayer, with hymns and sermon. When a good musical lead is available the psalm and canticles will be chanted.
- Morning Prayer
 - A modern language service, with hymns and sermon.
- Muddy Church
 - Outdoors for all ages (and dogs!). We gather in church where a theme is introduced. We then walk and talk for 30-40 minutes before arriving back at the church for refreshments.
